			Issue 1: Each Active SLO in Improve must match verbatim the COR.
			Solution 1: Develop Addendum to change SLOs during revision cycle.
			Solution 2: Update all SLOs in Nuventive Improve to be verbatim with what is in Course Outline of Record. Only Curriculum Committee team and Improve administrators will be given privilege of updating SLO statements (done for SLOs as of 11:20 am on 1/28/2018).
			Solution 3: For this one time only, change COR SLOs to match those currently active in Nuventive Improve. Only Curriculum Committee team and Improve administrators will be given privilege of updating SLO statements. (done for SLOs as of 11:20 am on 1/28/2018).
			Needed: Print out of each course and each SLO for that course as currently on Improve and on ECMS (i.e. two reports).
			Solution has been chosen. M. Tillman will assist in acquiring a copy

			of the courses along with their Student Learning Outcome statements that are currently part of the Course Outlines of Record housed in ECMS. M. Pape will then update the Active SLOs in Improve to match verbatim with the SLOs on the Outline or Record. This will mean that for some courses it will then appear that these courses have one of more SLOs that have not been assessed during cycle 2. Issue 2: The SLO statements worded exactly as they are on COR must be on each syllabus. The decision was for Academic Senate to reach out to the deans and to the department chairs to expedite the inclusion of SLO statements on each and every syllabus for Winter 2018.

Issue 1: Enforce a policy of regular assessment on the part of faculty and staff.
			Solution: Toño drafted a new signature form (modeled on the Hybrid Delivery Form) to accompany all course revision submissions. The signatories would comprise the SLO Core Committee, and would be aimed at verifying that all SLOs on the COR have been assessed at least once during the previous 5-year revision cycle. If a new course, then there must be in place method of assessment and a plan for assessment for each student learning outcome. There is a minimum of one learning

			outcome for each course. If 5-year revision: For each of the SLOs in your course, attach documentation for at least one assessment cycle that has been conducted during the last 5 years. Your documentation should clearly indicate: > The SLO Statement > The assessment method used > The year and quarter the assessment took place > A summary of the data collected > Any enhancements planned in light of the assessment Improve -> Reports -> Standard Reports -> click on Courses/services selected Choose just the one course Issue 2: Demonstrate more clearly how the PBTs use assessment to inform their decisions Possible Solutions: There was discussion about no resources if SLOAC % was not at a certain percentage. Justification for faculty, resources, facilities from Program Review could be used to show how assessment of SLOs justify needs CTE programs exit surveys (advisory boards, students) serve as means to assess program level outcomes and thus how outcomes drive academic planning Departments such as DMT and AUTO have included community outreach in their program All minutes should be uploaded to a central location Improve should contain a folder for minutes Every meeting should have a SLO/PLO agenda item
