COURSE DESCRIPTION

EWRT1A: Introduction to university level reading and writing, with an emphasis on analysis. Close examination of a variety of texts (personal, popular, literary, professional, academic) from culturally diverse traditions. Practice in common rhetorical strategies used in academic writing. Composition of clear, well-organized, and well-developed essays, with varying purposes and differing audiences, from personal to academic.

LART250: Integration of reading and writing skills necessary for success in EWRT 1A or EWRT 1AH. Emphasis on evaluation, analysis, synthesis, questioning, and critical inquiry of assigned readings and in essays in this course and in the target course, EWRT 1A or EWRT 1AH. Immersion in the reading and writing process with opportunities for just-in-time instruction on strategies and skills to succeed in transfer-level curriculum.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

EWRT1A

- * Practice writing as a multi-step process including planning and revising with attention to varying purposes, audiences, and rhetorical strategies.
- * Read and analyze rhetorically and culturally diverse narrative and expository texts from a variety of perspectives.

LART250

* Demonstrate the reading and writing process and metacognitive awareness in a combined reading and writing portfolio of your strongest work.

REQUIRED TEXTS

NOTE ABOUT ONLINE LEARNING: Remember that this class would normally meet for 8 hours per week if we met 100% face-to-face. Thus, for a hybrid class you are expected to "meet" online + in-person for 8 hours a week as well, whether that means coming to class, reviewing the lecture/tutorial information, posting to discussions, etc. which includes office hour meetings. In addition to the 8 hours a week, you will have homework assignments such as reading articles, preparing for papers, submitting mini-assignments, and so forth. These are not part of the 8 hours a week; they are considered "homework." In all, you will probably average between 16–24 hours a week for this class. You are expected to log onto Canvas regularly. There are at least 2-3 assignments due usually every day, so payattention to your Course Schedule.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

INDIVIDUAL MEETINGS: To meet the requirements of this Hybrid course and for Puente, you will be required to meet with me one-on-on on a scheduled Monday. More information to follow.

F2F CLASS MEETINGS: Every Wednesday, we will meet together in-person from 10:30 a.m. to 12:20 p.m. These are REQUIRED meetings so that we can build community and have live discussions.

PARTICIPATION: You can miss 2 of the required CLASS meetings for ANY reason you choose. You will start the quarter with 100 points for each course (EWRT1A + LART 250). After your 2 allowable absences, you will be deducted points for each unexcused absence: 10 points/absence or 5 points/tardiness (after more than 10 minutes).

TUTORING: You will attend a weekly half-hour tutoring session that will also count toward your LART250 grade. Be very mindful of the tutor's time and make sure you exchange contact information in case you both need to rearrange your session times.

JOURNALS: You will WRITE paragraph journals for readings and for your own stories (memoir). The journals will prepare students for their essays. There will be up 25+ journals, 20 of which your best scores will count toward your grade (all other scores beyond your best 20, will be dropped).

DISCUSSIONS: Throughout the quarter, you will post to discussion boards to brainstorm ideas with each other, collaborate with classmates, and so forth. There are 8 online discussions, and all of them are required.

MEMOIR: You will write a memoir which focuses on uplifting your voice that narrates various experiences of your life and can be modeled after several of our readings (including the novel) in this class. The memoir assignment will reinforce your writing practice while continuing to explore your identity and what it means to you.

PORTFOLIO: You will submit a final portfolio for the class that will be evaluated by other English department faculty. If your portfolio is evaluated as passing, your final grade for EWRT1A will be determined by how many points you have earned during the quarter. However, if your portfolio is evaluated as not passing, you will receive a D or an F in the class regardless of the number of points you have earned for EWRT1A during the quarter.

TIMED ESSAY: There will be two required timed essays in which students will write an argumentative essay of at least five paragraphs per essay. You will submit one of your timed essays in the final portfolio for the class. Students will have a 2-hour window to log on to Canvas, complete the essay, and submit it. Once you start the exam, you must complete it. You may not start again at another time. You may use whatever notes you want while taking the quizzes and exams except for fully written paragraphs ahead of time; however, make sure you are not plagiarizing for the timed essay exam and you must be the person taking the test rather than someone else.

ANALYTICAL FORMAL PAPERS: Not including the research paper, there are two 3-4 page papers that will address the topic for the unit. For units #1 and #2, the timed essay will be expanded into a longer paper. All papers must be typed and will be submitted through Canvas.

RESEARCH PAPER: You will rewrite your paper based on ideas from one of the other units as a research paper. In groups, you will research a topic related to any of the topics we covered in class. Then you will individually write papers by incorporating researched information to expand your formal paper for unit #4. The paper will be a minimum of 5-6 pages long. It must be typed and submitted through Canvas.

REWRITE: You will rewrite one of your formal papers and include it in the final portfolio for the class.

COVER LETTER: You will write a cover letter to present your work in your quarter-end portfolio.

TUTORIAL QUIZZES: Throughout the quarter, a series of grammar/writing tutorials are scheduled. There will be a quiz for each topic. Your lowest score will be dropped. If you miss a quiz, that will count as your lowest score. Most of the tutorials also have a voice recording, so you will need to listen to the whole tutorial rather than just paging through the slides. The tutorials were recorded by myself or former Puente instructor, Lydia Hearn.

VOCABULARY QUIZZES: Vocabulary lists will be posted on quizlet.com, and vocabulary quizzes will occur throughout the quarter. The first quiz will cover the first vocabulary list, but each subsequent list may include words from any of the previous vocabulary lists. There are 5 quizzes, and your lowest quiz score will be dropped.

LATE WORK: Paper assignments will close 1 week after the due date, and most other assignments will close 48 hours after the due date. You may submit your work late with a penalty before the assignment closes. The late penalty is a .15% deduction per HOUR it is late. All minutes are rounded up an hour. After the assignment closes, you will NOT be able to make up the work.

COURSE REGULATIONS

Dropping: The last day to drop this class with no grade is October 6. The last day to drop this class with a "W" is November 15. However, if you have not attended class and signed into Canvas for over a week, I have the option or dropping you from the course by either of the two drop dates.
